chickenpox	a common childhood disease caused by the varicella-zoster virus (VZV), also known as human herpes virus 3 (HHV-3)
measles	rubeola, an acute highly contagious disease, (often of childhood) caused by a virus, featuring a spreading red skin rash, fever, runny nose, cough and red eyes
German measles	a mild disease caused by the Rubella virus infecting the respiratory tract, and characterised by a rash of pink dots, fever and swollen lymph nodes
scarlet fever	a streptococcal infection, mainly occurring among children, and characterised by a red skin rash, sore throat and fever
mumps	a contagious disease caused by a virus of the genus Rubulavirus, mostly occurring in childhood, which causes swelling of glands in the face and neck
pneumonia	an acute or chronic inflammation of the lungs caused by viruses, bacteria or other microorganisms, or sometimes by physical or chemical irritants
ulcer	an open sore of the skin, eyes or mucous membrane, often caused by an initial abrasion and generally maintained by an inflammation and/or an infection
cancer	a disease in which the cells of a tissue undergo uncontrolled (and often rapid) proliferation
cancer screening	a checkup at the doctor's to see whether there are any cancer cells inside the body
