channel	the physical confine of a river or slough, consisting of a bed and banks
English Channel	an arm of the Atlantic Ocean that separates Great Britain from northern France, and joins the North Sea to the Atlantic
canal	an artificial waterway, often connecting one body of water with another
stream	a small river; a narrow body of moving water confined by banks
current	the part of a fluid that moves continuously in a certain direction
tide	the periodic change of the sea level, particularly when caused by the gravitational influence of the sun and the moon
low tide	the tide at its lowest level for a particular tidal cycle at a certain place
high tide	the natural tide at its highest level for a particular tidal cycle at a certain place
ice	water in frozen (solid) form
iceberg	a huge mass of ocean-floating ice which has broken off a glacier or ice shelf
snow	the frozen, crystalline state of water that falls as precipitation
island	a contiguous area of land, smaller than a continent, totally surrounded by water
peninsula	a piece of land projecting into water from a larger land mass



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
