



park	a tract of ground kept in its natural state, about or adjacent to a residence, as for the preservation of game, for walking, riding, or the like
national park	an area of land reserved by the national government for recreational use
nature reserve	an area of land managed to conserve wildlife or plant habitat or other natural features
bush	a horticultural rather than strictly botanical category of woody plant that is distinguished from a tree by its multiple stems and lower height, usually less than 6m tall
meadow	a piece of land covered or cultivated with grass, usually intended to be mown for hay
lawn	ground (generally in front of or around a house) covered with grass kept closely mown
hedge	a thicket of bushes, usually thorn bushes, especially such a thicket planted as a fence between any two portions of land
heath	a tract of level uncultivated land with sandy soil and scrubby vegetation

forest	a dense collection of trees covering a relatively large area, larger than woods
rain forest	a forest in a climate with high annual rainfall and no dry season
wood	the substance making up the central part of the trunk and branches of a tree, used as a material for construction, to manufacture various items
woods	a dense collection of trees covering a relatively small area; smaller than a forest
wilderness	an unsettled and uncultivated tract of land left in its natural state
jungle	a large, undeveloped, humid forest, especially in a tropical region, that is home to many wild plants and animals
swampland	low-lying land that is regularly flooded, especially such land that is drier than a bog or a marsh
